It has been some time since Wil Schweitzer's 2000 Triumph Roadster has been to a club event. So long in fact that quite a few members were astonished to see such a car in our midst, it was the hit of the event. And seeing it back on the road at the Clubs Anniversary Run brought back great memories for me that I would like to share with you.

It was back in the infancy of the club, July of 1978, that Wil had asked me to co-pilot his prized Roadster to the '78 Vintage Triumph Register's National Meet at Indianapolis Motor Speedway. I had just met Wil that winter as the club formed, and we quickly became good friends. I accepted his offer with great anticipation. We left the 'burgh early that July morning, I drove over to Wil's in my TR3 and left it in his garage, and we were off. Wil drove to Buckeye Lake Ohio on I-70 and after lunch he handed the driving duties over to me. This was my first time driving a right hand drive vehicle and to compound the difficulty, the column three speed shifter is backwards compared to an American car, 2nd gear was where reverse should be and 1st and 3rd switched. But I managed to get the car rollin' and soon we were in Columbus. Ah yes, Columbus, with a noon time traffic jam. Stop start grind coast, stop start grind coast, hey, I'm starting to get the hang of this.

The whole trip was a smashing success, highlights include a first place trophy for the Roadster (367 points out of 400, thank goodness for long term memory), two memorable laps around the Indianapolis 500 track (go ahead Wil, pass that pace car!), sleeping at the "Speedway Motel" (I wonder if I had Mario Andretti's room), watching some VTR guys trying to lift an Amphacar over the swimming pool fence (do you think it will float until morning? Hey, let's have another beer and watch!) and wondering at 60 MPH if 5 to 7 pounds of oil pressure was enough? That's right, Wil drove that car for 25 years with 5 pounds of oil pressure.

All I know is that was the farthest I had ever ventured from home in a Triumph, up to that time, and the last time I worried about whether or not a Triumph could make it.

From then on Wil, Linda and the Roadster were regulars at VTR and TRA conventions and our local events. Wil always ran the VTR autocrosses with it, albeit at a leisurely pace. It won best of show at our first two British Car Days at Hartwood. The Roadster always turned heads everywhere it went.

The last few years it has been off the road for an engine rebuild and some needed care. It is great to see it back in all its glory.


Thanks to all the participated, we hope to see you on next years DAM RUN.
