Distributor **Function**

Let's be brutally honest, here: most of us haven't a clue as to how correctly or incorrectly our car's distributor is functioning. Sure, some of you (like me) check dwell angle & timing at semi-regular intervals and lubricate the distributor cam and mechanical advance mechanism. However, it's safe to say that after 30 to 50 some odd years of operation, their operation is only a vague imitation of their original function.

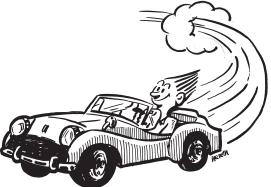
Look at it logically. Most of these cars were just plain TORTURED by the neglect of their original, and/or subsequent owners. Lack of lubrication, over-tightening of the clamp, months & years of sitting idle......it's all taken a toll.

Recently, in a quest for some of that gone-but-not forgotten performance, I tried out a few different distributors from my parts stash, and found that none of them were even close to working correctly. In fact, the total advance was so far beyond what it should have been that I felt I had to stop driving the car until I got it corrected (extreme spark advance = pre-ignition.....or DETONATION). I didn't want to risk an otherwise very healthy engine to detonation. In response to a request for information about rebuilding/restoration service for Lucas distributors, on the Spridget Talk List, the unanimous recommendation was to send it to Advanced Distributors (www.advanceddistributors.com) in Shakopee, Minnesota. I contacted the owner; Jeff Schlemmer, who directed me to the "advance curve" section of his website. There, I found and printed a very thorough questionnaire, which would give Jeff all of the information he needed to tailor my distributor to my car's (and my) needs.

I sent one of my core distributors out to Jeff (via UPS 2nd day air). In addition to making the tired, old distributor look absolutely concours, Jeff installed a new shaft bushing, repaired the cracked clamping ring (I'll NEVER need to worry about over-tightening the clamp, again), and modified the 1971 spec advance curve to his own interpretation of the 1967 specs. He also installed new points & condenser, and set the dwell angle precisely at 60 degrees. My total cost (excluding shipping) was \$139.00.

The difference in my Midget's performance, with the newly rebuilt distributor, is nothing short of ASTOUNDING. The idle is smooth & quiet, at 800 rpm, and the throttle response, at any rpm, in any gear is nothing short of direct and heartwarming.

So, instead of going out and spending major money for bolt-on "performance modifications", in a vain attempt to get your TR to keep up with my little MG Midget, spend \$99.00 (Jeff's basic charge, including shaft re-bushing) to have your worn out distributor rebuilt, and gain FULL use out of that Triumph's relatively large displacement engine (1275 cc vs. at least 2200cc). You will be amazed and delighted with the results

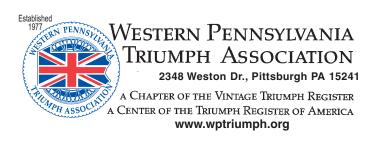

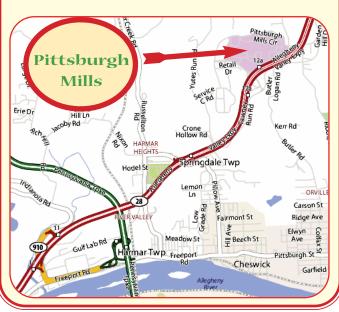
