FOT (Friends of Triumph) members are reporting serious problems with the Quick Rack. The Quick Rack is an aftermarket steering rack sold by Moss Motors and perhaps others; TRF does not sell it. It fits late TR4 thru TR6. I understand it is marked – Made in Argentina.

Several TR4 racers have experienced total steering failure while racing. Turns out the rack tube had pulled out of the pinion casting rendering it inoperable. Clearly a poor design.

MacGyver "Revisited"

While after a nice trip out to Carlisle with the "Wolf Pack", of course there were issues on the way home.

While on the way home on Route 31 outside of Champion, I hear a loud thunk followed by scrapping noise. Now at the same time as the loud thunk, the engine noise increased dramatically.

So, after carefully negotiating about one mile looking for a safe place to pull off the side of the road, Greg & I pulled into the parking lot at Sarnelli's Market in Champion.

First things first, the top has to be raised since the skies are threatening.

After that, both Greg and I are peering under the Spitfire for damage. Low and behold the exhaust pipe is broken at the start of the run after the downpipe. After routing around the trunk the best I could come up with was electrical tape.

So, I send Greg into the market looking for "duct tape", with the thoughts that duct tape is wider than electrical tape and we can tape the pipes together in order to make it home. No duct tape.

However, Greg comes up with the idea that there are 2 "fly swatters" for sale that must be about 20 years old, and the handles are made from a stiff metal. Now the collective minds are rolling.

Greg makes a case for using the metal handles from the fly swatters as a backbone at the break in order to hold the exhaust pipes stationery. So, first we remove the plastic from the "swatter end" (didn't want any fire issues").

Now we slip the clamps over both sides of the" break" and position the handles of the fly swatters as the backbone, and tighten down the clamps (see picture).

We now have an exhaust system that is not dragging, and we can continue on our way home.

On Sunday, I took the Spitfire to the local Monroe Muffler location here in Pleasant Hills and put the vehicle up on a rack. Needless to say, there should have been a support clamp where the break occurred.

The technician at Monroe Muffler was kind enough to fashion a sleeve over the break and weld it back into place.

The cost \$ 40.

What is the ABRR?

I was asked to write a more detailed article on the ABRR as the WPTA was mentioned in the Vintage Triumph Register. What is the ABRR? It is the America's British Reliability Run. Groups of British Car enthusiasts out to prove the mettle of their cars, have an excuse to get out and drive, and most importantly raise money for children.

The ABRR was first organized in 2002 by Blake Discher of Detroit with help from John McCartney, In the Shadow of My Father, Turn Left at the Pacific, and was based on similar events in the UK organized to raise money to help children.. Initially the first few ABRR's routes were run through the states of Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, and Wisconsin. America's British Reliability Run is a challenging, but fun, driving event that so far has raised more than \$160,000.00 for worthy children's charities. The routes cover approximately 500 to 750 miles of scenic byways and country roads over a two day period. Each two-person team pays their expenses out-of-pocket and has a goal of raising \$500 for the charity. The \$500.00 dollar amount is not a prerequisite and each team raises as much as it can. The charity is picked by each organizing group and is usually different each year.

The ABRR is not a race. The run is conducted on public roads at posted speeds. It is not exactly a rally either, in that there are no checkpoints or deliberately vague and misleading instructions. What it is, is a fun drive on great roads through beautiful countryside in the company of fellow British car hobbyists, and all for a good cause. The ABRR is open to up to 40 British cars of any marque and vintage.

If you are a subscriber of "Hemmings Sports and Exotic" magazine you may have read about the 2007, 2008, and 2012 Runs. In 2008 the Eastern version of the ABRR was initiated, the Delaware Valley Triumphs have organized several of these events with the latest being in 2013.

I wanted to attend the 2012 ABRR, but was not able to get time off from work. If you remember from a WPTA article I wrote I was able to make the ABRR for 2013 with my son Kevin.

The 2013 ABRR started Friday September 27th with a kick-off dinner at the Spinnerstown Inn in Quakertown PA. Aside from a great meal we received our windshield decals and car magnets which wood identify us as participants in the fund raiser. A donation for \$8000.00, which later grew to over \$10.000.00, was given to a representative of Children's Specialized Hospitals, this years children's charity. Sunoco oil also gave a donation and to help the event gave each team a free tank of gas to start and supplied all the gas for the chase vehicle.


